 <p>Betty Friedan Author of "The Feminine Mystique", the book credited with sparking the "second wave" of American feminism. 1921 - 2006</p>	 <p>Gloria Steinem Journalist and activist who became nationally recognized as a leader and spokesperson for the American feminist movement in the 1960s and 70s. 1934 -</p>	 <p>Andrea Dworkin A radical feminist activist and writer. Described a "male supremacist" ideology manifesting in sexual violence and prostitution. 1946 - 2005</p>	 <p>Shulamith Firestone A radical feminist writer and activist. Central figure in early development of radical feminism and "second wave" feminism. 1945 - 2012</p>	 <p>Ellen Willis A writer and activist who was a member of New York Radical Women. Co-founded the radical feminist group, "Bedstockings", with Shulamith Firestone in 1969. 1941 - 2006</p>	 <p>Naomi Wolf A prominent feminist author and journalist who authored "The Beauty Myth" in 1991, a highly influential feminist book discussing how beauty standards are used to oppress women in new ways. 1962 -</p>
 <p>Robin Morgan An author, poet, and activist who has been a key leader in the international feminist movement since the 1960s. 1941 -</p>	 <p>Heather Booth A civil rights activist and feminist, who, before abortion was legalized, ran an underground abortion service called "The Jane Collective". 1945 -</p>	 <p>Susan Sontag A writer, filmmaker, philosopher, teacher, and political activist. Created several widely known and greatly renewed works. Became a role model for many feminists and aspiring feminist writers in the 1960s and 70s. 1933 - 2004</p>	 <p>Meredith Tax A writer and political activist regarded as a pioneer of the American feminist movement. Her 1970 article, "Woman and Her Mind: The Story of Daily Life" is considered one of the founding documents of the feminist movement of that era. 1942 -</p>	 <p>Grace Paley A short story author, poet, teacher, and feminist activist. Wrote three critically acclaimed collections of short stories, compiled in the Pulitzer Prize and National Book Award finalist "The Collected Stories" in 1974. 1922 - 2007</p>	 <p>Eve Ensler A feminist, activist, playwright, and performer. Best known for her play "The Vagina Monologues", which Charles Isherwood of The New York Times called "probably the most important piece of political theater in the last decade". 1953 -</p>
 <p>Beate Sirota Gordon An Austrian-born American performing arts presenter and women's rights activist. Under General Douglas MacArthur, was highly involved in writing Japan's feminist laws into its post-WWII constitution. They are some of the most progressive in the world. 1923 - 2012</p>	 <p>Susan Faludi A feminist, journalist, and author. Won a Pulitzer Prize for Explanatory Journalism in 1991. Wrote many articles about feminism and the apparent resurgence by the movement, and a 1991 book titled "Backlash: The Undeclared War Against American Women". 1959 -</p>	 <p>Erica Jong A writer most famous for her 1973 novel "Fear Of Flying", which follows a free-person female protagonist who decides to indulge in extramarital sexual fantasies while on a trip to Vienna. It sold over 20 million copies, and became an icon of second-wave feminism. 1942 -</p>	 <p>Elizabeth Wurtzel A writer and bestselling author who wrote "Bitch: In Praise Of Difficult Women", a prominent feminist manifesto praising women who "believe in standing up for themselves" in a male-dominated world. 1967 - 2020</p>	 <p>Susan Brownmiller A feminist journalist, author, and activist best known for her 1975 book "Against Our Will: Men, Women, and Rape", which was selected by the New York Public Library as one of the 100 most important books of the 20th century. 1935 -</p>	 <p>Judith Butler A philosopher and gender theorist whose work has been highly influential on third wave feminist, queer theory, and literary theory. 1956 -</p>
 <p>Dorothy Dinnerstein An academic and activist best known for her 1976 book "The Mermaid and the Minotaur: Sexual Politics and the Birth of the Novel". Drawing from elements of psychoanalysis pioneered by Sigmund Freud and Melanie Klein, she argues that women's conversations around the domestic and maternal are rooted in women's monopoly over child-rearing, and that a radical shift in gender roles could fix humanity's core problems. 1923 - 1992</p>	 <p>Phyllis Chesler An American writer and psychotherapist who is known as a "feminist psychologist". Author of 18 books, mostly concerning feminism, gender, and other social issues. 1940 -</p>	 <p>Hedwig Dohm A German feminist and author who was one of the first feminist thinkers to see gender roles as a result of socialization and not biological determinism. 1831 - 1919</p>	 <p>Blu Greenberg A writer who specializes in Judaism and women's rights. Known for her work to bridge Judaism and feminism. 1936 -</p>	 <p>Gloria Allred A women's rights attorney known for taking high-profile and often controversial cases, particularly those involving the protection of women's rights. Inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame. 1941 -</p>	 <p>Bella Abzug An American congresswoman, lawyer, and leader in the feminist movement. Known as a leading figure in "eco-feminism". 1920 - 1998</p>
 <p>Gerda Lerner A historian and women's history author. One of the founders of the academic field of women's history. In 1963, while still an undergraduate at the New School for Social Research, she taught "Great Women in American History", considered to be the first regular college course on women's history offered anywhere. 1920 - 2013</p>	 <p>Miriam Schapiro An artist who was one of the foremost pioneers of the feminist art movement. Invented "femmage", collages created from objects made or cherished by women, in the 1970s. 1923 - 2015</p>	 <p>Judy Chicago A feminist artist and educator best known for her large collaborative art installation piece about birth and creation images, examining the role of women in history and culture. Founded the first feminist art program in the US at California State University Fresno in the 1970s. 1939 -</p>	 <p>Arlene Raven A feminist art historian, author, critic, educator, and curator. A major figure in the Feminist Art Movement. Co-founded numerous feminist art organizations in the 1970s. 1944 - 2006</p>	 <p>Hélène Cixous A French feminist writer and professor best known for her article "The Laugh of Medusa", which established her as one of the early thinkers in post-structural feminism. Founded the first centre of feminist studies in a European university at the University of Paris VIII in 1974. 1937 -</p>	 <p>Chantal Akerman A Belgian film director and substantially influential feminist figure who directed "Jeanne Dielman, 23 Quai du Commerce, 1080 Bruxelles", considered to be one of the greatest examples of feminist film making. 1950 - 2015</p>


